

Guideline

Heat deflection for polycarbonate trays

Heat Deflection Temperature:	270 degrees Fahrenheit
Continuous Use Temperature (= 24/7):	180 degrees Fahrenheit
Intermittent Use Temperature:	257 degrees Fahrenheit

Definitions and Notes:

- 1) Intermittent can mean long time periods like 24 hours. Intermittent requires temperature cycles to move up and then back down.
- 2) Note: At temperatures material can heat age over time. The material becomes more brittle or discolors with use. Heat aging may also make material more sensitive to chemicals and force.
- 3) Note/Disclaimer: This information is presented from the source manufacturer and is deemed to be reliable. However it is intended as a guideline. It is the sole responsibility of each buyer to make their own independent tests and decisions about whether any of these plastics are suitable for their packaging solution prior to purchasing.
